Later in the decade, the search for property close to Ivy Commons, the purchased and renovated property of the Ivy Community Center, Inc. began. The chapter felt that the Becton property on Fayetteville Road, approximately 1 mile from Ivy Commons was an ideal site for our Community Center. Artelia Melba Tennessee Bryant was a proud golden member, having 50 years of membership within the sorority, of the Alpha Zeta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®. She started her educational journey at the Hampton Institute of Hampton, Virginia. She later moved to North Carolina where she continued her education and was initiated into Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated® in 1942 at North Carolina College for Negroes, now North Carolina Central University. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Commerce, which she later used to assist the chapter in a major way. Mrs. Bryant served as Chairman of the Sorority House Committee and was the first President of the Ivy Community Center Board of Directors. A licensed real estate broker and owner of her own agency, Mrs. Bryant used these skills in the chapter's land acquisition. To commemorate this historic occasion members of the chapter gathered on the site, as seen below, for a time of land dedication on February 26, 2000.



TREMENDOUS TWO-THOUSANDS



Three years after the land purchase the construction of the original sorority house began. Pictured above you can see the initial house from February 2004. It was a dream coming true, to have a place to meet to call our own. After many setbacks the certificate of occupancy was issued in October of 2003. Dedication was delayed due to inclement weather, but at last our dream had come true. The house was dedicated on February 1, 2004. Five years later we were looking to build another sorority house. Lowes Home & Garden Company decided to build a store adjacent to our property and they needed our property for expansion. After much discussion the chapter accepted Lowes' offer. Our old building was being demolished and we were starting anew. On May 3, 2009 we dedicated a new and larger Ivy Community Center, as seen below.
